

is a Toronto pediatrician who has practiced medicine since 1970. He is a graduate of the University of Toronto medical school. In 1984 he established the first hospital-based breastfeeding clinic in Canada at Toronto's Hospital for Sick Children. He has practiced as a physician in Canada, New Zealand, and South Africa. He now holds breastfeeding clinics in several hospitals in the Toronto area. He is a consultant with UNICEF's Baby Friendly Hospital Initiative and is a popular speaker at breastfeeding conferences across North America and beyond. He is the father of three children, all breastfed.

TOPICS OF DISCUSSION:

CONTROVERSIES IN BREAST-FEEDING — AN OVERVIEW OF SEVERAL TOPICS

- ➤ What does % weight loss mean?
- It's OK to supplement formula in the first few days?
- ► Babies should be fed on a schedule? Jaundice requires supplementation or the interruption of breastfeeding?
- ► When a baby doesn't gain, then the only thing to do is supplement?
- ➤ Nipple shields are good tools?

OTHER TOPICS INCLUDE:

- ➤ What they didn't teach you about breastfeeding in your practice.
- The effects of birthing practices on breastfeeding.
- When a baby refuses to latch
- The norms of the breastfeeding baby.
- Skin to skin care.



CONFERENCE GOALS

- ▶ To gain practical knowledge, guidance and tools to deal with common breastfeeding controversies.
- ➤ To understand the implication of birthing practices (e.g. labour procedures/protocols, medications, labour support, skin to skin care) on breastfeeding.
- To understand the breastfeeding challenges experienced by caregivers of infants with medical conditions and providing breastfeeding management strategies.
