 - Includes: Plan B; Hep B testing/vaccination; HIV PEP
 - Regular follow-up (weekly for 1 month if HIV PEP treatment)
 - Social workers with specialization in sexual assault and domestic violence
 - Free counselling for unlimited duration
 - Services initiated by SADV are lifelong if continued by patient.
 - If not used for >1 year, patient is referred to the community
 - Forensic evidence collection:
 - Within 12 days (adults) or 72 hours (pediatrics)
