Measles Post-Exposure Guidance for Patients

I was exposed to an active measles case on:

I have been instructed to exclude myself from work, school, and other high-risk settings with susceptible contacts for <u>28 days</u>.

- Should I need to access my family doctor or emergency department, I should **call ahead** to ensure appropriate precautions are taken.
- If I have other non-urgent medical appointments (ex. diagnostics, dental, eye, etc.), I should consider **delaying the appointment** until the end of the isolation period and discuss with the healthcare provider all options, including a virtual appointment.
- If I am **exposed to measles again during this isolation period**, no additional treatment will be needed; however, I will be required to continue isolating for another 28 days following second exposure. Consultation with a family doctor or Public Health will be necessary.
- If I am exposed to measles <u>after</u> the 28-day isolation period, I may need to receive additional treatment and follow another 28-day isolation period. Consultation with a family doctor or Public Health will be necessary.
